#### **Assessment, progression and award**

12. Candidates may take no more than 40 credits from Level 2 modules at Level 3;
13. Candidates must take a total of 160 credits in Sociology over Levels 2 and 3 combined and a total of 80 credits in Law over Levels 2 and 3 combined;
14. Modules marked with a # must be passed at 40% or above in order to progress to the ordinary degree at the next Level.
15. Modules marked with a \* are not available in 2015-2016.

#### **Professional accreditation**

16. It is **not** possible for candidates who follow this programme to gain exemption for the purposes of legal professional qualification.
