Assessment, progression and award

- 7. Modules marked with a # must be passed at 40% or above in order to progress to the Ordinary stream at the next level.
- 8. A student who is registered for the BA Accounting and Management programme and who wishes to transfer to the MAcc Management Accounting programme and is suitably qualified to do so, shall be permitted to transfer subject to the approval of the Director of Undergraduate Studies;
- 9. A student who is registered for the MAcc Management Accounting programme and who wishes to transfer to the BA Accounting and Management programme shall be permitted to transfer subject to the approval of the Director of Undergraduate Studies.

Professional accreditation

10. Durham University Business School is accredited by the European Quality Improvement System (EQUIS) for a period of three years from 2014 and by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) for a period of five years from 2013.

Year 3 (Business Placement / Study Abroad)

- 11. Students admitted to the BA Accounting and Management (NN42) are able to apply to transfer to the BA Accounting and Management (with Business Placement) programme (N204) or the BA Accounting and Management (with Study Abroad) programme (N206).
- 12. Candidates wishing to transfer to the BA Accounting and Management (with Business Placement) (N204) or the BA Accounting and Management (with Study Abroad) (N206) must:
 - a. have successfully completed Level 1 of the BA Accounting and Management (NN42) and progressed to Level 2 of the honours or Ordinary programme, and;
 - b. during the first term of Level 2 study, apply to the Board of Studies in the Business School to be admitted to the BA Accounting and Management (with Business Placement) (N204) or the BA Accounting and Management (with Study Abroad) (N206) and have their application approved by the Chair of the Board of Studies in the Business School; and
 - c. successfully complete Level 2 of the BA Accounting and Management (NN42) so as to be eligible to progress to Level 3 of the BA Accounting and Management (NN42) Honours programme.

Business Placement

- 13. Students will undertake an approved work placement of not less than 40 weeks. Student progress will be assessed at threshold level by continuous assessments of the student's performance during the placement and a final report. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the BA Accounting and Management with Business Placement.
- 14. Students who the Board of Examiners for the Business School deem to have made satisfactory progress on the Business Placement will continue to Level 3 of the BA Accounting and Management (with Business Placement) (N204). Students who have not made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will not be permitted to continue on BA Accounting and Management (with Business Placement) (N204), but must instead proceed to Level 3 of the BA Accounting and Management (NN42) programme.

Study Abroad

15. Students will undertake an approved study placement in an overseas university. Student progress will be assessed at module level by the host University. Assessment does not

- contribute to the marks used to determine the award of degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the BA Accounting and Management with Study Abroad.
- 16. Students who the Board of Examiners for the Business School deem to have made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will continue to Level 3 of the BA Accounting and Management (with Study Abroad) (N206). Students who have not made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will not be permitted to continue on BA Accounting and Management (with Study Abroad) (N206), but must instead proceed to Level 3 of the BA Accounting and Management (NN42) programme.
