### **Assessment, progression and award**

8. Modules marked with a # must be passed at 40% or above in order to progress to the ordinary degree at the next Level.

### **Professional accreditation**

9. Durham University Business School is accredited by the European Quality Improvement System (EQUIS) for a period of three years from 2014 and by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) for a period of five years from 2013.

### **Year 3 (Business Placement / Study Abroad)**

10. Students admitted to the BSc Finance (N305) are able to apply to transfer to the BSc Finance (with Business Placement) programme (N306) or the BSc Finance (with Study Abroad) programme (N307).
11. Candidates wishing to transfer to the BSc Finance (with Business Placement) (N306) or the BSc Finance (with Study Abroad) (N307) must:
- have successfully completed Level 1 of the BSc Finance (N305) and progressed to Level 2 of the honours or Ordinary programme, and;
  - during the first term of Level 2 study, apply to the Board of Studies in the Business School to be admitted to the BSc Finance (with Business Placement) (N306) or the BSc Finance (with Study Abroad) (N307) and have their application approved by the Chair of the Board of Studies in the Business School; and
  - successfully complete Level 2 of the BSc Finance (N305) so as to be eligible to progress to Level 3 of the BSc Finance (N305) Honours programme.

### **Business Placement**

12. Students will undertake an approved work placement of not less than 40 weeks. Student progress will be assessed at threshold level by continuous assessments of the student's performance during the placement and a final report. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the BSc Finance with Business Placement.
13. Students who the Board of Examiners for the Business School deem to have made satisfactory progress on the Business Placement will continue to Level 3 of the BSc Finance (with Business Placement) (N306). Students who have not made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will not be permitted to continue on BSc Finance (with Business Placement) (N306), but must instead proceed to Level 3 of the BSc Finance (N305) programme.

### **Study Abroad**

14. Students will undertake an approved study placement in an overseas university. Student progress will be assessed at module level by the host University. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the BSc Finance with Study Abroad.

15. Students who the Board of Examiners for the Business School deem to have made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will continue to Level 3 of the BSc Finance (with Study Abroad) (N307). Students who have not made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will not be permitted to continue on BSc Finance (with Study Abroad) (N307), but must instead proceed to Level 3 of the BSc Finance (N305) programme.
