BA ENGLISH LITERATURE AND HISTORY (QV21)

1. This programme is available at Durham City, in a full-time mode of study. The lead department is English Studies.

Level 1 (Certificate)

2. Candidates will study and be assessed in modules to the value of 60 credits from List A:

Modules to the value of 60 credits from the Level 1 entry for the BA in English Literature	60

3. Candidates will also study and be assessed in modules to the value of 60 credits from List B:

One module chosen from Lists A or B in the entry for the BA in History	20

Level 2 (Diploma)

4. In accordance with the core regulations, candidates may take no more than 30 credits of Level 1 modules during Level 2.
5. Candidates will study and be assessed in the following modules to the value of 20 credits:

6. Candidates will study and be assessed in modules to the value of 20 credits from List C:

7. Candidates will also study and be assessed in modules to the value of 40 credits from List D:

8. Candidates will also study and be assessed in modules to the value of 40 credits from **Lists B** and **C** in the entry for the [BA in English Literature](#) or the Level 2 entry for the [BA in History](#).

Level 3 (Degree)

9. In accordance with the core regulations, candidates may take no more than 30 credits of Level 2 modules during Level 3.

10. Candidates will study and be assessed in modules to the value of 40 credits from List E:

Modules up to the value of 40 credits chosen from the Level 3 entry for the BA in English Literature	40

11. Candidates will also study and be assessed in modules to the value of 80 credits, including **EITHER** 80 credits from List F, **OR** 20 credits from List F and 60 credits from List G:

Modules to the value of 20 credits from Lists B and C in the entry for the BA in English Literature	0-20

One module from the Level 2 entry for the BA in History	0-20

List G:	Credit value
Modules up to the value of 60 credits chosen from List J in the BA in History	60

Assessment, progression and award

12. All candidates must submit a dissertation, in either English or History, in Level 3.

13. Over Levels 2 and 3, students must choose credits to the value of at least 100, and no more than 140, from those offered by each Board of Studies.
