1. This programme is available at Durham City, in a full-time mode of study. The lead department is English Studies.

2. Candidates will study and be assessed in modules to the value of 60 credits from List A:

Level 3 (Degree)

- 9. In accordance with the core regulations, candidates may take no more than 30 credits of Level 2 modules during Level 3.
- 10. Candidates will study and be assessed in modules to the value of 40 credits from List E:

11. Candidates will also study and be assessed in modules to the value of 80 credits, including **EITHER** 80 credits from List F, **OR** 20 credits from List F and 60 credits from List G:

## Assessment, progression and award

- 12. All candidates must submit a dissertation, in either English or History, in Level 3.
- 13. Over Levels 2 and 3, students must choose credits to the value of at least 100, and no more than 140, from those offered by each Board of Studies.
