Assessment, progression and award

10. Modules marked with a # must be passed at 40% or above in order to progress to the ordinary degree at the next Level.

Year 3 (Placement Abroad/Year Abroad)

- 12. Students admitted to the BA Education Studies Theology and Religion (X1V6) are able to apply to transfer to the BA Education Studies Theology and Religion (with Placement Abroad) programme (X3V6) or the BA Education Studies Theology and Religion (with Year Abroad) programme (X2V6).
- 13. Candidates wishing to transfer to the BA Education Studies Theology and Religion (with Placement Abroad) (X3V6) or the BA Education Studies Theology and Religion (with Year Abroad) (X2V6) must:
 - a. have successfully completed Level 1 of the Education Studies Theology and Religion (X1V6) and progressed to Level 2 of the Honours or Ordinary programme; and
 - b. during the first term of Level 2 study, apply to the Board of Studies in the School of Education to be admitted to the BA Education Studies Theology and Religion (with Placement Abroad) (X3V6) or the BA Education Studies Theology and Religion (with Year Abroad) (X2V6) and have their application approved by the Chair of the Board of Studies; and
 - c. secure an international placement abroad/ year abroad opportunity, agreed with the School Exchange Co-ordinator; and
 - d. successfully complete Level 2 of the Education Studies Theology and Religion (X1V6) so as
 to be eligible to progress to Level 3 of the Education Studies Theology and Religion (X1V6)
 programme.

Placement Abroad

- 14. Students undertaking the BA Education Studies Theology and Religion (with Placement Abroad) (X3V6) are required to spend a period of residence of no less than 7 months in a country, or in several countries, completing a placement agreed with the School Exchange Coordinator.
- 15. During the course of their time abroad, students will complete a reflective project which will be assessed as pass/fail. The focus of the project will be agreed with the School Exchange Coordinator prior to the student undertaking the placement abroad and will be documented in the Student Placement Agreement. The task will be submitted prior to the end of the Easter term of Year 3. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of the degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the BA Education Studies Theology and Religion (with Placement Abroad).
- 16. Students who the Board of Examiners for the School of Education deem to have made satisfactory progress on the placement abroad will continue to Level 3 of the BA Education Studies Theology and Religion (with Placement Abroad) (X3V6). Students who have not made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will not be permitted to continue on the BA Education Studies Theology and Religion (with Placement Abroad) (X3V6) programme, but must instead proceed to Level 3 of the BA Education Studies Theology and Religion (X1V6) programme.

Year Abroad

- 17. Students undertaking the BA Education Studies Theology and Religion (with Year Abroad) (X2V6) will undertake an approved study placement in an overseas university taking a course of study chosen in consultation with the programme director and the host institution.
- 18. During the year abroad students will be assessed at module level by the host University. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of the degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the BA Education Studies Theology and Religion (with Year Abroad).

19. Students who the Board of Examiners for the School of Education deem to have made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will continue to Level 3 of the BA Education Studies - Theology and Religion (with Year Abroad) (X2V6). Students who have not made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will not be permitted to continue on the BA Education Studies - Theology and Religion (with Year Abroad) (X2V6) programme, but must instead proceed to Level 3 of the BA Education Studies - Theology and Religion (X1V6) programme.
