- 6. Total credits may exceed 180 by up to 5 if a 20-credit language module is taken. A language module of more than 20 credits may be taken only with the agreement of the Programme Director, and must be accommodated within the overall 180-credit limit.
- 7. Modules marked with a ~ must be passed at 50% or above; a mark of 40-49% cannot be compensated.
