- 2. Duration: full-time (12 months), part-time (24 months)

Specialisms available within programme

3. The MA Music programme allows students to pursue a variety of specialisms.

Four specialisms will normally be offered every year:

Musicology (P1) Ethnomusicology (P2) Composition (P3) Performance (P4)

A section of the following additional specialisms may be offered every year as resources permit:

British Music (P5) Music Analysis (P6) Choral Conducting (P7) Advanced Organ Studies (P8) Electronic Music (P9) Orchestration and Arranging (P10) Indian Music (P11) World Music Analysis (P12) Music, Mind, and Culture (P13) Audiovisual Documentation and Analysis (P14)

The design of each specialism is similar: students must choose modules from lists A, B, C, and D below.

6. Candidates shall also study and be assessed in a module to the value of 60 credits from List C which is linked to their chosen specialism.

Students specialising in Musicology (P1), Ethnomusicology (P2), British Music (P5), Music Analysis (P6), Indian Music (P11), World Music Analysis (P12), Music, Mind, and Culture (P13), or Audiovisual Documentation and Analysis (P14) must take the **Dissertation** module.

Students specialising in Composition (P3) or Electronic Music (P9) must take the **Portfolio of Composition** module.

Students specialising in Music Performance (P4), Choral Conducting (P7), or Advanced Organ Studies (P8) must take the **Performance Project** module.

Students specialising in Orchestration and Arrangement (P10) must take the **Portfolio of Orchestration and Arrangements** module.
