

**MA Education (X9K907)**

1. Location: Durham City
2. Duration: 12 months (full-time) or 36 months (Part-time). The programme will normally begin in October each year for full-time students and in October or January for part-time students.
3. Candidates whose first language is not English will normally be required to possess a recent English language test score of 7.0 overall or higher (with no element under 6.5) in IELTS, or an equivalent qualification.

**Assessment, progression and award**

6. An exemption to the core regulations for APL has been granted to permit students who hold a Postgraduate Certificate in Education (with relevant specialism) with QTS (X6K114/X7K214) awarded by Durham University in the previous academic year to replace their 90 credits of optional modules with: Teaching and learning in the Curriculum ([EDUC40030](#)); Self-Directed Study ([EDUC43230](#)); Professional Issues in School based Education ([EDUC31730](#)).
7. If a candidate fails a module he/she may be given an opportunity to resit the relevant examination(s) before the end of the academic year at a time to be determined by the Board of Examiners.
8. In accordance with the core regulations, students may exit the programme with the following lower awards: Postgraduate Certificate in Professional Studies in Education (60 credits); Postgraduate Diploma in Professional Studies in Education (120 credits).
9. Candidates who originally registered for the award of MA Education who wish to transfer to the EdD programme must satisfactorily complete all taught modules and have satisfied a Transfer Review Panel derived from the School of Education's Board of Examiners before proceeding to the level 5 compulsory modules and subsequently submitting their thesis.
10. Students who successfully complete the Postgraduate Certificate in the Practice of Education and are admitted to commence the University of Durham's MA Education within 3 calendar years of completing the Certificate will be exempted from the relevant 60 credits of the MA. This has no implications for the process of application and admission to the MA which must be carried out according to the approved procedures and criteria.
