# MArts Geography with Year Abroad (L705)

- 1. This programme is available at Durham City, in a full-time mode of study.
- 2. \* From October 2018, entry to the four-year MArts (Geog) degree programme is available by transfer from the BA (Geog) degree programme only. Transfer is based on application in Level 2 of the BA programme and places are allocated on a competitive basis, subject to the agreed target of course places available. The September Board of Examiners in Geography will rank Level 2 weighted mean results for the cohort of students that applied to transfer to the programme earlier in Level 2. Transfer between programmes is not an entitlement, and is decided by the Board of Examiners in Geography.

#### Assessment, progression and award

- 14. Modules marked with a # must be passed at 40% or above in order to progress to the ordinary degree at the next Level.
- 15. Modules marked with a ¥ cannot be taken in conjunction with each other.
- 16. At Level 2 a student who fails to achieve the standards required under the Core Regulations for progression to Level 3 of the MArts in Geography (L703) but who achieves the standard required for progression to Level 3 of a Bachelors programme may progress to Level 3 of the BA in Geography (L702) in the Honours or Ordinary stream in accordance with the Core Regulations.
- 17. A student whose achievement at the end of Level 3 does not qualify them to proceed to Level 4 may be awarded the degree of BA Geography (L702) with Honours or Ordinary in accordance with the Core Regulations for the award of a Bachelors degree.

## Additional Year Abroad

- 18. Students admitted to the MArts Geography (L703) are able to apply to transfer to the MArts Geography (with Year Abroad) programme (L705). Students undertaking the MArts Geography (with Year Abroad) programme (L705) will undertake an approved study placement in an overseas university taking a course of study chosen in consultation with the programme director and the host institution. During the year abroad students will be assessed at module level by the host University. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of the degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the MArts Geography with Year Abroad.
- 19. Candidates wishing to transfer to the MArts Geography (with Year Abroad) (L705) must:
  - a. have successfully completed Level 1 of the MArts Geography (L703) and progressed to Level 2 of the honours or Ordinary programme, and;
  - b. during the first term of Level 2 study, apply to the Board of Studies in the Department of Geography to be admitted to the MArts Geography (with Year Abroad) (L705) and have their application approved by the Chair of the Board of Studies in the Department of Geography, and;
  - c. successfully complete Level 2 of the MArts Geography (L703) so as to be eligible to progress to Level 3 of the MArts Geography (L703) Honours programme.
- 20. Students who the Board of Examiners for the Department of Geography deem to have made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will continue to Level 3 of the MArts Geography (with Year Abroad) (L705). Students who have not made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will not be permitted to continue on the MArts Geography (with Year Abroad) (L705) programme, but must instead proceed to Level 3 of the MArts Geography (L703) programme.
