- 9. Candidates shall study and be assessed in modules to the value of 40 credits chosen from the list of Level 3 modules in the entry for BA Sociology.
- 10. Candidates shall also study and be assessed in modules to the value of 40 credits chosen from List D in the entry for BA Anthropology.

Assessment, progression and award

- 11. Modules marked with a # must be passed at 40% or above in order to progress to the ordinary degree at the next Level.
- 12. 10 credit modules can only be taken with a corresponding 10 credit module in the subsequent term.
- 13. Modules marked with a ~ must be passed at 40% or above for the award of an honours degree. A mark of 30 39% cannot be compensated.
- 14. Only one modern foreign language module marked § may be taken at Level 1 and only one such module at Levels 2 and 3 combined.
- 15. ^ the total number of SOCI / modern foreign language credits taken from Lists C and D combined should equal 60.
- 16. Modules marked with ≠ cannot be taken if already chosen under List C.
- 17. ^ The total number of ANTH / modern foreign language credits taken from Lists C and E combined should equal 60.

Year abroad

18. Students admitted to the BA Anthropology and Sociology (LL36) are able to apply to transfer to the BA Anthropology and Sociology (with Year Abroad) programme (LL63). Students undertaking the BA Anthropology and Sociology (with Year Abroad) (LL63) programme will undertake an approved study placement in an overseas university taking a course of study chosen in consultation with the programme director and the host institution. During the year abroad students will be assessed at module level by the host University. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of the degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the BA Anthropology and Sociology with Year Abroad.

- Candidates wishing to transfer to the BA Anthropology and Sociology (with Year Abroad) (LL63) must:
 - a. have successfully completed Level 1 of the BA Anthropology and Sociology (LL36) and progressed to Level 2 of the honours or Ordinary programme, and;
 - b. during the first term of Level 2 study, apply to the Board of Studies in the School of Applied Social Sciences to be admitted to the BA Anthropology and Sociology (with Year Abroad) (LL63) and have their application approved by the Chair of the Board of Studies in the School of Applied Social Sciences, and;
 - c. successfully complete Level 2 of the BA Anthropology and Sociology (LL36) so as to be eligible to progress to Level 3 of the BA Anthropology and Sociology (LL36) Honours programme.
- 20. Students who the Board of Examiners for the School of Applied Social Sciences deem to have made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will continue to Level 3 of the BA Anthropology and Sociology (with Year Abroad) (LL63). Students who have not made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will not be permitted to continue on the BA Anthropology and Sociology (with Year Abroad) (LL63) programme, but must instead proceed to Level 3 of the BA Anthropology and Sociology (LL36) programme.
