### **Admissions**

English language requirements: Candidates whose first language is not English will
normally be required to demonstrate proficiency in the English language by possessing a
recent English language test score of 7 or above in IELTS (with no element below 6.5), or
600 or above in TOEFL PBT; or 102 or above with no element below 25 in TOEFL IBT;
or an equivalent qualification
