### **Assessment, progression and award**

9. Modules marked with a # must be passed at 40% or above in order to progress to the ordinary degree at the next Level.
10. Modules marked with a ~ must be passed at 40% or above for the award of an honours degree. A mark of 30 – 39% cannot be compensated.
11. Modules to the value of at least 100 credits and no more than 140 credits may be taken in each subject area over Levels 2 and 3.
12. Modules marked with a \* are not available in 2017/2018.

### **Professional accreditation**

13. Durham University Business School is accredited by the European Quality Improvement System (EQUIS) for a period of five years from 2017 and by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) for a period of five years from 2013.

### **Year 3 (Work Placement / Study Abroad)**

14. Students admitted to the BA Economics and Politics (LL12) are able to apply to transfer to the BA Economics and Politics (with Work Placement) programme (LL02) or the BA Economics and Politics (with Study Abroad) programme (LL01).
15. Candidates wishing to transfer to the BA Economics and Politics (with Work Placement) (LL02) or the BA Economics and Politics (with Study Abroad) (LL01) must:
  - a. have successfully completed Level 1 of the BA Economics and Politics (LL12) and progressed to Level 2 of the honours or Ordinary programme, and;
  - b. during the first term of Level 2 study, apply to the Director of Undergraduate Studies in the Business School to be admitted to the BA Economics and Politics (with Work Placement) (LL02) or the BA Economics and Politics (with Study Abroad) (LL01) and have their application approved by the Director of Undergraduate Studies in the Business School; and
  - c. successfully complete Level 2 of the BA Economics and Politics (LL12) so as to be eligible to progress to Level 3 of the BA Economics and Politics (LL12) Honours programme.

### **Work Placement**

16. Students will undertake an approved work placement of not less than 40 weeks. Student progress will be assessed at threshold level by continuous assessments of the student's performance during the placement and a final report. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the BA Economics and Politics with Work Placement.

17. Students who the Board of Examiners for the Business School deem to have made satisfactory progress on the Work Placement will continue to Level 3 of the BA Economics and Politics (with Work Placement) (LL02). Students who have not made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will not be permitted to continue on BA Economics and Politics (with Work Placement) (LL02), but must instead proceed to Level 3 of the BA Economics and Politics (LL12) programme.

### **Study Abroad**

18. Students will undertake an approved study placement in an overseas university. Student progress will be assessed at module level by the host University. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the BA Economics and Politics with Study Abroad. Students should pass a minimum of 40 ECTS credits, or equivalent, to successfully complete the year, as set out in their Learning Agreement.
19. Students who the Board of Examiners for the Business School deem to have made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will continue to Level 3 of the BA Economics and Politics (with Study Abroad) (LL01). Students who have not made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will not be permitted to continue on BA Economics and Politics (with Study Abroad) (LL01), but must instead proceed to Level 3 of the BA Economics and Politics (LL12) programme.
