6. During the course of their time abroad, students will complete a project based on Japanese language sources culminating in a 5,000 word essay in English with a 1,000 character abstract in Japanese. This will be supervised by email and is to be submitted by 1st September preceding the fourth year of study. Students who gain a pass mark in this will be registered for the “Japanese Studies (With Year Abroad)” degree; students who do not will be registered for the “Japanese Studies” degree.
