MSc Risk (L7K409)

1. This programme is available at Durham City, in a full-time (12 months) mode of study and as a part-time course over two years.
2. Candidates whose first language is not English are normally required to achieve an overall IELTS score of at least 6.5 and no element under 6.0. In all cases the relevant certificate should have been issued within two years of application.
