MA Applied Linguistics for TESOL (Q3K807)

- 1. Location: Durham City.
- 2. Duration: full-time (12 months), part-time (24 months)

Admissions

- 3. Admissions criteria:
 - a. Candidates must have at least two years of professional working experience.
- 4. English language requirements:
 - a. Non-native English speakers must have achieved an IELTS score of at least 7 with at least 7 in each section.

Programme structure

- 5. There are two streams within the programme. These provide candidates with the option of further focussing their Masters qualification by adding a particular specialism. The two streams lead to different degree titles:
 - a. MA Applied Linguistics for TESOL (Q3K807)
 - b. MA Applied Linguistics for TESOL (English for Academic Purposes) (Q3K907)
- 6. Candidates wishing to be eligible for the degree title named in 5.b. above must choose the following modules as part of their programme and pass them at 50% or above:
