- 10. Candidates shall study and be assessed in modules to the value of 40 credits chosen from the list of Level 3 modules in the Department of Sociology.
- 11. Candidates shall also study and be assessed in modules to the value of 40 credits chosen from Level 3 (List B) in the entry for BA Anthropology.

Assessment, progression and award

- 12. Modules marked with a # must be passed at 40% or above in order to progress to the ordinary degree at the next Level.
- 13. \$ Level 1 module taken at Level 2, permissible under clause 6 of the University's core regulations.
- 14. Only one module offered by the University's Centre for Foreign Language Study marked § may be taken at Level 1 and only one such module at Levels 2 and 3 combined. Note that if Doing Anthropological Research ANTH1101 is taken at Level 2, a Level 1 20 credit module offered by the University's Centre for Foreign Language Study cannot also be taken at Level 2.
- 15. * From 2019-20, <u>ANTH1101</u> Doing Anthropological Research is a prerequisite for <u>ANTH2131</u> Anthropology Field Course and LL36 students wishing to take <u>ANTH2131</u> at Level 2 must choose <u>ANTH1101</u> at Level 1. For 2018-19 only, LL36 students must take <u>ANTH1101</u> Doing Anthropological Research as a co-requisite if they are taking <u>ANTH2131</u> Anthropology Field Course. Interrogating Anthropology <u>ANTH2151</u> must be taken with the co-requisite <u>ANTH2131</u> Anthropology Field Course.

Year abroad

16. Students admitted to the BA Anthropology and Sociology (LL36) are able to apply to transfer to the BA Anthropology and Sociology (with Year Abroad) programme (LL63). Students undertaking the BA Anthropology and Sociology (with Year Abroad) (LL63) programme will undertake an approved study placement in an overseas university taking a course of study chosen in consultation with the programme director and the host institution. During the year abroad students will be assessed at module level by the host University. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of the degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the BA Anthropology and Sociology with Year Abroad.

- 17. Candidates wishing to transfer to the BA Anthropology and Sociology (with Year Abroad) (LL63) must:
 - a. have successfully completed Level 1 of the BA Anthropology and Sociology (LL36) and progressed to Level 2 of the honours or Ordinary programme, and;
 - during the first term of Level 2 study, apply to the Board of Studies in the School of Applied Social Sciences to be admitted to the BA Anthropology and Sociology (with Year Abroad) (LL63) and have their application approved by the Chair of the Board of Studies in the School of Applied Social Sciences, and;
 - c. successfully complete Level 2 of the BA Anthropology and Sociology (LL36) so as to be eligible to progress to Level 3 of the BA Anthropology and Sociology (LL36) Honours programme.
- 18. Students who the Board of Examiners for the Department of Sociology deem to have made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will continue to Level 3 of the BA Anthropology and Sociology (with Year Abroad) (LL63). Students who have not made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will not be permitted to continue on the BA Anthropology and Sociology (with Year Abroad) (LL63) programme, but must instead proceed to Level 3 of the BA Anthropology and Sociology (LL36) programme.
