#### Assessment, progression and award

9. Modules marked with a # must be passed at 40% or above in order to progress to the Ordinary stream at the next level.
10. Modules marked with a ¥ must be taken in conjunction with each other.
11. Modules marked with a \* are not available in 2018/19.
12. At Level 2 a student who fails to achieve the standards required under the Core Regulations for progression to Level 3 of the MAcc Management Accounting but who achieves the standard required for progression to Level 3 of a Bachelors programme may progress to Level 3 of the BA Accounting and Management in the Honours or Ordinary stream in accordance with the Core Regulations.
13. At Level 2 a student who is qualified to progress from Level 2 to level 3 of the MAcc Management Accounting but wishes to transfer to Level 3 of the BA Accounting and Management shall be permitted to do so.
14. A student whose achievement at the end of Level 3 does not qualify them to proceed to Level 4 may be awarded the degree of BA Accounting and Management with Honours or Ordinary in accordance with the Core Regulations for the award of a Bachelors degree.
15. A student whose achievement at the end of Level 4 does not qualify them to be awarded the degree of MAcc Management Accounting may be awarded the degree of BA Accounting and Management with Honours in accordance with the Core Regulations for the award of a Bachelors degree.

#### Professional accreditation

16. Durham University Business School is accredited by the European Quality Improvement System (EQUIS) for a period of five years from 2017 and by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) for a period of five years from 2013.

#### Year 3 (Business Placement / Study Abroad)

17. Students admitted to the MAcc Management Accounting (N401) are able to apply to transfer to the MAcc Management Accounting (with Business Placement) programme (N404) or the MAcc Management Accounting (with Study Abroad) programme (N406).
18. Candidates wishing to transfer to the MAcc Management Accounting (with Business Placement) (N404) or the MAcc Management Accounting (with Study Abroad) (N406) must:
  - a. have successfully completed Level 1 of the MAcc Management Accounting (N401) and progressed to Level 2 of the honours or Ordinary programme, and;
  - b. during the first term of Level 2 study, apply to the Director of Undergraduate Studies in the Business School to be admitted to the MAcc Management Accounting (with Business Placement) (N404) or the MAcc Management Accounting (with Study Abroad) (N406) and have their application approved by the Director of Undergraduate Studies in the Business School; and
  - c. successfully complete Level 2 of the MAcc Management Accounting (N401) so as to be eligible to progress to Level 3 of the MAcc Management Accounting (N401) Honours programme.

#### Business Placement

19. Students will undertake an approved work placement of not less than 40 weeks. They must have successfully completed 240 credits at Levels 1 and 2 to progress to the placement. Student progress will be assessed at threshold level by continuous assessments of the student's performance during the placement and a final report. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the MAcc Management Accounting with Business Placement.
20. Students who the Board of Examiners for the Business School deem to have made satisfactory progress on the Business Placement will continue to Level 3 of the MAcc Management Accounting (with Business Placement) (N404). Students who have not made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will not be permitted to continue on MAcc Management Accounting (with Business Placement) (N404), but must instead proceed to Level 3 of the MAcc Management Accounting (N401) programme.

### **Study Abroad**

21. Students will undertake an approved study placement in an overseas university. Student progress will be assessed at module level by the host University. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the MAcc Management Accounting with Study Abroad. Students should pass a minimum of 40 ECTS credits, or equivalent, to successfully complete the year, as set out in their Learning Agreement.
22. Students who the Board of Examiners for the Business School deem to have made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will continue to Level 3 of the MAcc Management Accounting (with Study Abroad) (N406). Students who have not made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will not be permitted to continue on MAcc Management Accounting (with Study Abroad) (N406), but must instead proceed to Level 3 of the MAcc Management Accounting (N401) programme.
