### Year 3 (Year Abroad)

- 5. Students are required to complete a full academic year studying Chinese at an educational institution in China, and to complete all of the assessments associated with their studies.
- 6. During the course of their time abroad, students will complete a project based on Chinese language sources culminating in a 5,000 word essay in English with a 1,000 character abstract in Chinese. This will be supervised by email and is to be submitted by 1st September preceding the fourth year of study. Students who gain a pass mark in this and fulfil the requirements stated in clause 5 above will be registered for the "Chinese Studies (With Year Abroad)" degree; students who do not will be registered for the "Chinese Studies" degree.

- 6. Students are required to spend their third year abroad studying Chinese at an educational institution in China.
- 7. During the course of their time abroad, students will complete a project based on Chinese language sources culminating in a 5,000 word essay in English with a 1,000 character abstract in Chinese. This will be supervised by email and is to be submitted by 1<sup>st</sup> September preceding the fourth year of study. Students who gain a pass mark in this will be registered for the "Chinese Studies (With Year Abroad)" degree; students who do not will be registered for the "Chinese Studies" degree.
