### **Assessment, progression and award**

9. Modules marked with a # must be passed at 40% or above in order to progress to the ordinary degree at the next Level.
10. Modules marked with a ~ must be passed at 40% or above for the award of an honours degree. A mark of 30 – 39% cannot be compensated.
11. Modules marked with a ¥ cannot be taken in conjunction with each other.
12. Modules marked with a ± are only available to candidates who have passed Biology A2 level at Grade B or higher, or who possess an equivalent qualification.
13. Modules marked \* are not running in 2018-19.

### **Professional Accreditation**

14. This programme is accredited on an ongoing basis from the 2012-13 intake as conferring eligibility for the Graduate Basis for Chartered Membership of the British Psychological Society. Students entering in and after October 2006 need to achieve a minimum of a second class honours degree to gain eligibility.

### **Year 3 (UK Placement/Placement Abroad/Year Abroad)**

15. Students admitted to the BA Education Studies – Psychology (X1C8) are able to apply to transfer to the BA Education Studies - Psychology (with UK Placement) programme (XC83) or the BA Education Studies – Psychology (with Placement Abroad) programme (XC81) or the BA Education Studies – Psychology (with Year Abroad) programme (XC82).

16. Candidates wishing to transfer to the BA Education Studies - Psychology (with UK Placement) programme (XC83) or the BA Education Studies – Psychology (with Placement Abroad) (XC81) or the BA Education Studies – Psychology (with Year Abroad) (XC82) must:
- have successfully completed Level 1 of the BA Education Studies – Psychology (X1C8) and progressed to Level 2 of the Honours or Ordinary programme; and
  - during the first term of Level 2 study, apply to the Board of Studies in the School of Education to be admitted to the BA Education Studies - Psychology (with UK Placement) programme (XC83) or the BA Education Studies – Psychology (with Placement Abroad) (XC81) or the BA Education Studies – Psychology (with Year Abroad) (XC82) and have their application approved by the Chair of the Board of Studies; and
  - secure a UK placement/international placement abroad/ year abroad opportunity, agreed with the School Exchange Co-ordinator; and
  - successfully complete Level 2 of the BA Education Studies – Psychology (X1C8) so as to be eligible to progress to Level 3 of the BA Education Studies - Psychology (X1C8) programme.

### **UK Placement**

17. Students undertaking the BA Education Studies - Psychology (with UK Placement) (XC83) are required to spend a period of residence of no less than 7 months completing a UK-based placement agreed with the School Exchange Co-ordinator.
18. During the course of their time on placement, students will complete a reflective project which will be assessed as pass/fail. The focus of the project will be agreed with the School Exchange Co-ordinator prior to the student undertaking the placement and will be documented in the Student Placement Agreement. The task will be submitted prior to the end of the Easter term of Year 3. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of the degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the BA Education Studies - Psychology (with UK Placement).
19. Students who the Board of Examiners for the School of Education deem to have made satisfactory progress on the UK placement will continue to Level 3 of the BA Education Studies - Psychology (with UK Placement) (XC83). Students who have not made satisfactory progress on the UK Placement will not be permitted to continue on the BA Education Studies - Psychology (with UK Placement) (XC83) programme, but must instead proceed to Level 3 of the BA Education Studies - Psychology (X1C8) programme.

### **Placement Abroad**

20. Students undertaking the BA Education Studies – Psychology (with Placement Abroad) (XC81) are required to spend a period of residence of no less than 7 months in a country, or in several countries, completing a placement agreed with the School Exchange Co-ordinator.
21. During the course of their time abroad, students will complete a reflective project which will be assessed as pass/fail. The focus of the project will be agreed with the School Exchange Co-ordinator prior to the student undertaking the placement abroad and will be documented in the Student Placement Agreement. The task will be submitted prior to the end of the Easter term of Year 3. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of the degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the BA Education Studies – Psychology (with Placement Abroad).
22. Students who the Board of Examiners for the School of Education deem to have made satisfactory progress on the placement abroad will continue to Level 3 of the BA Education Studies – Psychology (with Placement Abroad) (XC81). Students who have not made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will not be permitted to continue on the BA Education Studies – Psychology (with Placement Abroad) (XC81) programme, but must instead proceed to Level 3 of the BA Education Studies – Psychology (X1C8) programme.

## **Year Abroad**

23. Students undertaking the BA Education Studies – Psychology (with Year Abroad) (XC82) will undertake an approved study placement in an overseas university taking a course of study chosen in consultation with the programme director and the host institution.
24. During the year abroad students will be assessed at module level by the host University. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of the degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the BA Education Studies – Psychology (with Year Abroad).
25. Students who the Board of Examiners for the School of Education deem to have made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will continue to Level 3 of the BA Education Studies – Psychology (with Year Abroad) (XC82). Students who have not made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will not be permitted to continue on the BA Education Studies – Psychology (with Year Abroad) (XC82) programme, but must instead proceed to Level 3 of the BA Education Studies – Psychology (X1C8) programme.
