## Assessment, progression and award

- 8. Modules marked with \* are not available in 2019-2020
- 9. Modules marked with ¥ require the approval of the Board of Studies concerned and of the Degree Programme Director in Theology and Religion.
- 10. Modules marked with # require the approval of the Programme Director of the validated MA in Theology and Ministry and of the Degree Programme Director in Theology and Religion.
- Modules marked with \*\* require candidates to take Extended Study in Theology and Religion (THEO 43710) in conjunction with any 20 credit module from the Department of Theology and Religion.
- 12. Modules marked with \*\*\* require candidates to take Extended Study in Foreign Language (THEO 45310) in conjunction with any 20 credit module from the Centre for Foreign Language Study.
- 13. Modules marked with ~ must be passed with a mark of at least 50% to proceed. These modules may not be compensated.
- 14. Candidates who select credits at Levels 1-3 must select at least 150 credits at Level 4 or above, and no more than 190 credits in total. Candidates who select all modules at Level 4 or above must select 180 credits in total.
- 15. Before proceeding to the doctoral thesis stage, candidates are required to have passed all taught modules in the taught phase. At the end of the taught phase candidates will have preliminary registration on the Thesis while awaiting confirmation of results by the Board of Examiners. Only on the successful completion of all taught modules will the registration be confirmed. A student wishing to progress to the research phase of a PhD with Integrated Studies must obtain an overall average mark of at least 60% in the assessment of their taught modules, after resits if necessary as set out below. Any student who does not obtain an overall average mark of at least 65% will be required to withdraw from their PhD with Integrated Studies. [Note that a concession has been approved by QSSC for a higher progression requirement to that specified in para 30 of the core regulations for Integrated PhDs).
- 16. If the Level 5 module THEO 50460 is failed, or if the candidate chooses not to proceed to the doctoral thesis stage, the candidate may be re-registered for the module at Level 4 (THEO 53160) and the work assessed against the outcomes for the module and awarded a mark in accordance with the Core Regulations. In cases where Board of Examiners deems the module to have been passed at Level 4, the candidate will be allowed to exit the programme with an award, as described in paragraph 12.
- 17. Candidates may leave the programme with a named lower award subject to the following restrictions:

- a. MA Theology and Religion (V8K407): candidates must obtain a mark of 50% or more in 180 credits;
- b. MA Biblical Studies (V8K207) or MA Christian Theology (V8K707) or MA Christian Theology (Anglican Studies) (V8K507) or MA Christian Theology (Catholic Studies) (V8K607) or MA Religion and Society (V8K107): candidates must obtain a mark of 50% or more in 180 credits in a combination permissible under the individual named programme regulations for that programme.
- c. Postgraduate Diploma in Theology and Religion: candidates must obtain a mark of 50% or more in at least 120 credits.
- d. Postgraduate Certificate in Theology and Religion: candidates must obtain a mark of 50% or more in at least 60 credits;
- e. that, where work contributing to the exit award has previously been marked at Level 5, it is re-marked at Level 4 to permit the award to be made with Merit or Distinction if the performance is such to justify this.
