MA Museum and Artefact Studies (V6K607)

1. This programme is available at Durham City in a full-time (12 months) or part-time (24 months) mode of study.

Admissions

- 2. In considering applications a candidate's experience of museums and artefacts will carry significant weight.
- 3. The programme is intended for students who hold a first degree or other appropriate qualification and who wish to acquire knowledge and practical experience in museum and material culture studies.
- 4. English language requirements: IELTS 7.0 or above with no component below 6.5; TOEFL IBT (Internet Based Test) 102 or above (with no component below 25).

10. Candidates will also be required to attend such fieldwork/museum visits/work placements as may be deemed appropriate by the Board of Studies.

Assessment, progression and award

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- 11. If a candidate fails a module he/she may be given an opportunity to resit the relevant assessment(s) before the end of the academic year at a time to be determined by the Department.
- 12. The award of MA 'with distinction' will be made to those candidates who achieve an average mark (at the first attempt) of at least 70% in modules to the value of 180 credits and the achievement of at least 70% in the Dissertation (ARCH 55360) where that programme route has been chosen.
- 13. The award of 'MA with Merit' will be made to those candidates who achieve an average mark (at the first attempt) of at least 60% in modules to the value of 180 credits where the candidate does not meet the criteria for the award of distinction and the achievement of at least 60% in the Dissertation (ARCH 55360) where that programme route has been chosen.
- 14. Modules Marked with a ~ must be passed at 50% or above; a mark of 40-49% cannot be compensated.
