## **MA Music (W3K707)**

1. Location: Durham City

2. Duration: full-time (12 months), part-time (24 months)

### Specialisms available within programme

3. The MA Music programme allows students to pursue a variety of specialisms.

Four specialisms will be offered every year:

Musicology (P1)

Ethnomusicology (P2)

Composition (P3)

Performance (P4)

The design of each specialism is similar: students must choose modules from lists A, B, C, and D below.

#### Programme structure

4. Candidates shall study and be assessed in the following modules from List A:

Candidates shall study and be assessed in a module to the value of 30 credits from List B which corresponds to their chosen specialism (shown in brackets), as available.

6. Candidates shall also study and be assessed in a module to the value of 60 credits from List C which is linked to their chosen specialism.

Students specialising in Musicology (P1) or Ethnomusicology (P2) must take the **Dissertation** module.

Students specialising in Composition (P3) must take the **Portfolio of Composition** module.

Students specialising in Music Performance (P4) must take the **Performance Project** module.
