BSc Psychology (C800); BSc Psychology (With Year Abroad) (C801); BSc Psychology (with Placement) (C806)

1. This programme is available at Durham City, in a full-time mode of study.

Admissions

Year Abroad

2. The BSc Psychology with Year Abroad (C801) programme is only available to students admitted to the BSc Psychology (C800) programme.
3. Candidates wishing to transfer to BSc Psychology (with Year Abroad) (C801) must:
 - a. have successfully completed BSc Psychology (C800) Level 1 and progressed to Level 2 of the Honours or Ordinary programme;
 - b. during the first term of Level 2 study, apply to the Board of Studies in Psychology to be admitted to the BSc Psychology (with Year Abroad) (C801) and have their application approved by the Chair of the Board of Studies in Psychology;
 - c. successfully complete Level 2 of the BSc Psychology (C800) so as to be eligible to progress to Level 3 of the BSc Psychology (C800) Honours programme.

Placement

4. Candidates wishing to transfer to BSc Psychology (with Placement) (C806) must:
 - a. have successfully completed BSc Psychology (C800) Level 1 and progressed to Level 2 of the Honours or Ordinary programme;
 - b. during the first term of Level 2 study, apply to the Board of Studies in Psychology to be admitted to the BSc Psychology (with Placement) (C806) and have their application approved by the Chair of the Board of Studies in Psychology;
 - c. successfully complete Level 2 of the BSc Psychology (C800) so as to be eligible to progress to Level 3 of the BSc Psychology (C800) Honours programme.

Year 3 (Year Abroad)

8. Students will undertake an approved placement in an overseas university taking a course of study chosen in consultation with the programme director and the host institution.
9. Students whom the Board of Examiners deems to have made satisfactory progress on the year abroad, judged by reference to each student's learning agreement, will continue to Level 3 of the BSc Psychology (with Year Abroad) (C801) programme. Students who have not made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will not be permitted to continue on the BSc Psychology (with Year Abroad) (C801) programme, but must instead proceed to the final year of the BSc Psychology (C800) programme

Year 3 (Placement)

10. Students will undertake an approved placement taking a course of study chosen in consultation with the programme director and the host institution.
11. Students whom the Board of Examiners deems to have made satisfactory progress on the placement, judged by reference to each student's learning agreement, will continue to Level 3 of the BSc Psychology (with Placement) (C806) programme. Students who have not made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will not be permitted to continue on the BSc Psychology (with Placement) (C806) programme, but must instead proceed to the final year of the BSc Psychology (C800) programme

Students entering in and after October 2006 need to achieve a minimum of a second class honours degree to gain eligibility.
