4. Modules marked with a ~ must be passed at 50% or above; a mark of 40-49% cannot be compensated.
5. Modules marked with # are advanced engineering modules and should normally only be taken by students with a good Engineering Degree or equivalent experience.
6. Modules marked with % are advanced social anthropology modules and should normally only be taken by students with a good first degree in social anthropology or cognate discipline, and with excellent English writing skills.
7. Candidates who select a 20-credit module may select up to 185 credits in total.
8. Candidates who wish to conduct an ethnographic (empirical, qualitative) dissertation are advised to take the option 'Fieldwork, Interpretation and Representation'.
