Year 3 (Year Abroad)

Students should pass a minimum of 40 ECTS credits to successfully complete the year.

Assessment, progression and award

10. Students who the Board of Examiners for the Business School deem to have made satisfactory progress on the Year Abroad will continue to Level 3 of the BA Economics with French (L1R1). Students who have not made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will not be permitted to continue on BA Economics with French (L1R1), but must instead proceed to Level 3 of the BA Economics (L100) programme.
