#### Year 3 (Year Abroad)

- 6. Students admitted to the BA Visual Arts and Film (VA01) are able to transfer to the BA Visual Arts and Film (with Year Abroad) programme (VA02). Students taking the BA Visual Arts and Film (with Year Abroad) are required to complete a full academic year undertaking an approved placement with an appropriate cultural organisation, which may be in the public, private, or third sector. During the course of their placement, students will undertake tasks that meet defined learning outcomes as set out in an approved learning agreement with the placement host.
- 7. Following their year abroad, students will complete a Placement Portfolio and Report in English. This will be non-credit-bearing, but a percentage mark will be recorded on the transcript. In order to fulfil the requirements of the programme 'with Year Abroad' the Placement Portfolio and Report must receive a mark of 40% or above. Candidates who pass will proceed to the BA in Visual Arts and Film (with Year Abroad); those who fail will be transferred to the non-year abroad version of the programme.
- 8. Students wishing to transfer to the BA Visual Arts and Film (with Year Abroad) must:
  - a. have successfully completed Level 1 of the BA Visual Arts and Film (VA01) and progressed to Level 2 of the Honours or Ordinary programme; and
  - b. during the first term of Level 2 study, apply to the Board of Studies in the School of Modern Languages and Cultures to be admitted to the BA Visual Arts and Film (with Year Abroad (VA02) and have their application approved by the Chair of the Board of Studies; and
  - c. successfully complete Level 2 of the BA Visual Arts and Film (VA01) programme so as to be eligible to progress to Level 3.
