### Assessment, progression and award

- 9. Modules marked with a # must be passed at 40% or above in order to progress to the ordinary degree at the next Level.
- 10. Modules marked with a \* are not available in 2020-2021.

### Year 3 (Placement Year/Year Abroad)

- Students admitted to the BA Education Studies Sociology (XL33) are able to apply to transfer to the the BA Education Studies - Sociology (with Placement Year) programme (X3L3) or the BA Education Studies - Sociology (with Year Abroad) programme (X2L3).
- 12. Candidates wishing to transfer to the BA Education Studies Sociology (with Placement Year) (X3L3) or the BA Education Studies Sociology (with Year Abroad) (X2L3) must:
  - a) have successfully completed Level 1 of the BA Education Studies Sociology (XL33) and progressed to Level 2 of the Honours or Ordinary programme; and
  - b) during the first term of Level 2 study, apply to the Board of Studies in the School of Education to be admitted to the BA Education Studies - Sociology (with Placement Year) (X3L3) or the

BA Education Studies - Sociology (with Year Abroad) (X2L3) and have their application approved by the Chair of the Board of Studies; and

- c) liaise with the Faculty Placement Coordinator to arrange a suitable UK/ International work placement as part of the Faculty Placement Module or liaise with the School International Exchange Coordinator to arrange a study abroad opportunity; and
- d) successfully complete Level 2 of the BA Education Studies Sociology (XL33) so as to be eligible to progress to Level 3 of the BA Education Studies Sociology (XL33) programme.

### **Placement Year**

- 13. Students undertaking the BA Education Studies Sociology (with Placement Year) (X3L3) are required to spend a period of residence of no less than 7 months (or no less than 24 weeks in 2020/21) in a country, or in several countries, completing a placement agreed with the School Exchange Co-ordinator.
- 14. During the course of their time abroad, students will complete a reflective project which will be assessed as pass/fail. The focus of the project will be agreed with the School Exchange Coordinator prior to the student undertaking the placement abroad and will be documented in the Student Placement Agreement. The task will be submitted prior to the end of the Easter term of Year 3. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of the degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the BA Education Studies - Sociology (with Placement Year).
- 15. Students who the Board of Examiners for the School of Education deem to have made satisfactory progress on the Placement Year will continue to Level 3 of the BA Education Studies Sociology (with Placement Year) (X3L3). Students who have not made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will not be permitted to continue on the BA Education Studies Sociology (with Placement Year) (X3L3) programme, but must instead proceed to Level 3 of the BA Education Studies Sociology (XL33) programme.

#### Year Abroad

- 16. Students undertaking the BA Education Studies Sociology (with Year Abroad) (X2L3) will undertake an approved study placement in an overseas university taking a course of study chosen in consultation with the programme director and the host institution.
- 17. During the year abroad students will be assessed at module level by the host University. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of the degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the BA Education Studies Sociology (with Year Abroad).
- 18. Students who the Board of Examiners for the School of Education deem to have made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will continue to Level 3 of the BA Education Studies Sociology (with Year Abroad) (X2L3). Students who have not made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will not be permitted to continue on the BA Education Studies Sociology (with Year Abroad) (X2L3) programme, but must instead proceed to Level 3 of the BA Education Studies Sociology (XL33) programme.
