Programme structure

- 6. There are two streams within the programme. These provide candidates with the option of further focussing their Masters qualification by adding a particular specialism. The two streams lead to different degree titles:
 - a. MA Applied Linguistics for TESOL (Q3K807)
 - b. MA Applied Linguistics for TESOL (English for Academic Purposes) (Q3K907)
