With the approval of the Director of Undergraduate Studies in Law, one Level 2 or 3 module to the value of 20 credits chosen from those offered by another Board of Studies (including appropriate Level 1 credit-bearing language modules offered by the Centre for Foreign Language Study). In total, only one Level 2 (or Level 1 language) module may be taken at Level 3.		20

Any 10-credit module must be taken in conjunction with another 10-credit module, such that the total of credits from List B is 80 credits. 10-credit modules offered by another Board of Studies may be selected so long as this principle is observed.

### **Assessment, progression and award**

7. Level 1 modules marked with a # must be passed at 40% or above in order to progress into Level 2. Failing one Level 1 module (30-39%) marked with ~ will result in a transfer to the Ordinary Degree, which will not be a Qualifying Law Degree (see point 10).
8. Level 2 modules marked with a # must be passed at 40% or above in order to progress to the next Level. The Dissertation (LAW 3022) must be passed at 40% or above in order to be awarded an Honours/Ordinary degree.
9. Modules marked with a \* are not available in 2021-22.

### **Professional Accreditation**

10. This degree has been approved as a qualifying law degree by the Solicitors Regulation Authority (SRA); subject to successful completion of modules marked with †.

### **Year Abroad**

11. Students admitted to the LLB Law (M101) are able to apply to transfer to the LLB Law (with Year Abroad) programme (M103). Students undertaking the LLB Law (with Year Abroad) (M103) programme will undertake an approved study placement in an overseas university taking a course of study chosen in consultation with the programme director and the host institution. During the year abroad students will be assessed at module level by the host University. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of the degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the LLB Law with Year Abroad.
12. Candidates wishing to transfer to the LLB Law (with Year Abroad) (M103) must:
  - a. have successfully completed Level 1 of the LLB Law (M101) and progressed to Level 2 of the honours or Ordinary programme, and;
  - b. during the first term of Level 2 study, apply to the Board of Studies in Law to be admitted to the LLB Law (with Year Abroad) (M103) and have their application approved by the Chair of the Board of Studies in Law, and;
  - c. successfully complete Level 2 of the LLB Law (M101) so as to be eligible to progress to Level 3 of the LLB Law (M101) Honours programme achieving an average of 60.00% or above (lower average at the discretion of the Year Abroad Coordinator in consultation with the Chair of the Board of Examiners).
13. Students who the Board of Examiners for Law deem to have made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will continue to Level 3 of the LLB Law (with Year Abroad) (M103). Students who have not made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will not be permitted to continue on the LLB Law (with Year Abroad) (M103) programme, but must instead proceed to Level 3 of the LLB Law (M101) programme.
