Year 3 (Year Abroad)

- 5. Students are required to complete a full academic year studying Japanese at an educational institution in Japan, and to complete all of the assessments associated with their studies.
- 6. During the course of their time abroad, students will complete a summative Year Abroad assignment for the language they wish to study at Level 3. The assignments will be submitted before the start of the Michaelmas Term of the candidate's final year of study. Part-time candidates will be assessed at the start of the year in which the Level 3 compulsory language module is taken. Candidates who pass will proceed to the BA Japanese Studies with Year Abroad (T202). Those who fail will be transferred to the non-year abroad version of the programme, the BA Japanese Studies (T204).

Year 3 (Year Abroad)

- 5. Students are required to complete a full academic year studying Japanese at an educational institution in Japan, and to complete all of the assessments associated with their studies.
- 6. During the course of their time abroad, students will complete a project based on Japanese language sources culminating in a 5,000 word essay in English with a 1,000 character abstract in Japanese. This will be supervised by email and is to be submitted by the first Monday in September preceding the fourth year of study. Students who gain a pass mark in this and fulfil the requirements stated in clause 5 above will be registered for the "Japanese Studies (With Year Abroad)" degree; students who do not will be registered for the "Japanese Studies" degree (BA Japanese Studies (T204); the regulations for this programme reflect those of T202 at Levels 1, 2 and 3).
