Assessment, progression and award

7. In accordance with the core regulations, students may exit the programme with the following lower awards: Postgraduate Certificate in Professional Studies in Education (60 credits); Postgraduate Diploma in Professional Studies in Education (120 credits).
8. If a candidate fails a module he/she may be given an opportunity to resit the relevant examination(s) before the end of the academic year at a time to be determined by the Board of Examiners.
9. Candidates who originally registered for the award of MA Education who wish to transfer to the EdD programme must satisfactorily complete all taught modules and have satisfied a Transfer Review Panel derived from the School of Education's Board of Examiners before proceeding to the level 5 compulsory modules and subsequently submitting their thesis.
10. Modules marked with a ~ must be passed at 50% or above; a mark of 40-49% cannot be compensated.
