## Postgraduate Certificate in Academic Practice (X9K814)

1. Location: Durham City.
2. Duration: 48 - 60 months (Part-time). Participants are normally expected to complete the compulsory probationary requirement of 40 credits in 12 months.
3. Applicants will normally be newly appointed probationary academic staff/ teaching fellows at Durham University.
4. The last intake of students for this programme was October 2019.

### Assessment, progression and award

7. At the end of the first two modules participants may choose to:
  - a. register immediately for a further 20 credit module (to be completed within 12 months) to receive the PG CAP;
  - b. register up to three years after completion of the two compulsory modules for a third module (this module must be completed within 12 months) to complete the PG CAP;
  - c. withdraw from the programme after completing the probationary requirement.
8. This programme will be assessed on a pass / fail basis.
9. Successful completion of the two compulsory modules (EDUC 40320 and EDUC 40420) will enable participants to gain Fellowship of the Higher Education Academy.
