Year Abroad

- 10. Students admitted to the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (C603) are able to apply to transfer to the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (with Year Abroad) programme (C605). Students undertaking the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (with Year Abroad) (C605) programme will undertake an approved study placement in an overseas university taking a course of study chosen in consultation with the programme director and the host institution. During the year abroad students will be assessed at module level by the host University. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of the degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity with Year Abroad.
- 11. Candidates wishing to transfer to the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (with Year Abroad) (C605) must:
 - a. have successfully completed Level 1 of the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (C603) and progressed to Level 2 of the honours or Ordinary programme, and;
 - b. during the first term of Level 2 study, apply to the Board of Studies in the Department of Sport and Exercise Sciences to be admitted to the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (with Year Abroad) (C605) and have their application approved by the Chair of the Board of Studies in the Department of Sport and Exercise Sciences, and;
 - c. successfully complete Level 2 of the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (C603) so as to be eligible to progress to Level 3 of the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (C603) Honours programme.
- 12. Students who the Board of Examiners for the Department of Sport and Exercise Sciences deem to have made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will continue to Level 3 of the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (with Year Abroad) (C605). Students who have not made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will not be permitted to continue on the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (with Year Abroad) (C605) programme, but must instead proceed to Level 3 of the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (C605) programme, but must instead proceed to Level 3 of the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (C603) programme.

Placement Year

13. Students admitted to the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (C603) are able to apply to transfer to the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (with Placement Year) programme (C609). Students taking the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (with Placement Year) (C609) will undertake an approved placement in a UK or overseas organisation consisting of at least 40 weeks of professional-level work experience.

Following the placement year, students will be required to successfully complete a placement assessment as agreed by the Department, to determine whether the programme learning

outcomes have been met. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of the degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (with Placement Year) (C609). If a student fails, they will transfer to the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (C603) programme.

- 14. Candidates wishing to transfer to the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (with Placement Year) (C609) must:
 - a. have successfully completed Level 1 of the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (C603) and progressed to Level 2 of the Honours or Ordinary programme; and
 - b. during the first term of Level 2 study, apply to the Board of Studies in the Department of Sport and Exercise Sciences to be admitted to the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (with Placement Year) (C609) and have their application approved by the Chair of the Board of Studies; and
 - c. secure a placement / year abroad opportunity comprising at least 40 weeks of professionallevel work experience, agreed with the Departmental Placement Year Convenor and Faculty Placement Officer; and
 - d. successfully complete Level 2 of the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (C603) so as to be eligible to progress to Level 3 of the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (C603).
- 15. Students whom the Board of Examiners for the Department of Sport and Exercise Sciences deem to have fulfilled the programme learning outcomes and who successfully pass the placement assessment will continue to Level 3 of the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (with Placement Year) (C609). Students who fail will not be permitted to continue on the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (with Placement Year) (C609) programme, but must instead proceed to the final year of the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity programme (C603).

Students undertaking the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (with Year Abroad) (C605) programme will undertake an approved study placement in an overseas university taking a course of study chosen in consultation with the programme director and the host institution. During the year abroad students will be assessed at module level by the host University. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of the degree but successful completion is required to gualify for the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity with Year Abroad.
- 11. Candidates wishing to transfer to the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (with Year Abroad) (C605) must:
 - have successfully completed Level 1 of the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (C603) a. and progressed to Level 2 of the honours or Ordinary programme, and;
 - during the first term of Level 2 study, apply to the Board of Studies in the Department of Sport b. and Exercise Sciences to be admitted to the BA Sport. Exercise and Physical Activity (with Year Abroad) (C605) and have their application approved by the Chair of the Board of Studies in the Department of Sport and Exercise Sciences, and;

- c. successfully complete Level 2 of the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (C603) so as to be eligible to progress to Level 3 of the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (C603) Honours programme.
- 12. Students who the Board of Examiners for the Department of Sport and Exercise Sciences deem to have made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will continue to Level 3 of the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (with Year Abroad) (C605). Students who have not made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will not be permitted to continue on the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (with Year Abroad) (C605) programme, but must instead proceed to Level 3 of the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (with Year Abroad) (C605) programme, but must instead proceed to Level 3 of the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (C603) programme.

Placement Year

If a student fails, they will transfer to the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (C603) programme.

 - d. successfully complete Level 2 of the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (C603) so as to be eligible to progress to Level 3 of the BA Sport, Exercise and Physical Activity (C603).
