- 1. This programme is available at Durham City, in full-time or part-time study.
- 2. This programme is suspended until October 2024.

## Admissions

- 3. Admissions criteria:
  - a. An undergraduate degree in History or a related subject
  - b. A 2:1, with an overall average score of 65% or above, or a GPA of 3.5 or above, or equivalent.
- 4. English language requirements:
  - a. Band A
- 5. Candidates shall study and be assessed in the following modules:
