# Postgraduate Certificate in Learning and Teaching in Higher Education (X9KG14)

- 1. Location: Durham City.
- 2. Duration: 18 60 months (Part-time). Participants on pathway A are normally expected to complete the 60 credit module in 18 months.
- 3. Applicants for pathway A will normally be newly early career academic staff (teaching and research track, teaching track) at Durham University.
- 4. Applicants for pathway B will normally be newly appointed early career academic staff (teaching and research track, teaching track) on short term contracts, professional services staff with a learning support role, and PGR students and research staff with teaching responsibilities at Durham University.
- 5. The last intake of students for this programme was October 2019.

#### PATHWAY A:

9. Successful completion of 60-credits will enable participants to gain Fellowship of the Higher Education Academy.

## **PATHWAY B:**

- 10. Successful completion of the first 30-credits will enable participants to gain Associate Fellowship of the Higher Education Academy.
- 11. Participants who successfully complete the first module and have sufficient relevant experience and practice opportunities will be able to progress to the second core module.
- 12. Successful completion of the second module will enable participants to gain Fellowship of the Higher Education Academy.
