Assessment, progression and award

- 6. Project reports for <u>ENGI45560</u> are submitted in August, in advance of an oral examination before the end of August.
- 7. Modules marked (~) in the programme structure section must be passed at 50% or above; a mark of 40-49% cannot be compensated.
- 8. A maximum of 20 credits may be compensated in the degree in line with the Engineering Council statement on compensation and condonement.
- The programme meets the accreditation requirements of the Engineering Accreditation Board (EAB, <u>www.engc.org.uk/eab</u>) for Further Learning for a Chartered Engineer (CEng) for candidates who have already acquired an accredited CEng (partial) BEng (Hons) or an accredited IEng (Full) BEng/BSc (Hons) undergraduate first degree.
- 10. In accordance with University Core Regulations, students who have failed more than 20 but not exceeding 45 credits, and have satisfied the requirements for compensation, may be awarded an MSc Engineering Studies.
- 11. The MSc Engineering Studies (H1KL09) is an exit award only. The MSc Engineering Studies award does <u>not</u> meet the accreditation requirements of the Engineering Accreditation Board (EAB, <u>www.engc.org.uk/eab</u>) for Further Learning for a Chartered Engineer (CEng) for candidates who have already acquired an accredited CEng (partial) BEng (Hons) or an accredited IEng (Full) BEng/BSc (Hons) undergraduate first degree.
