Durham University Business School is accredited by the European Quality Improvement System (EQUIS) for a period of five years from 2022 and the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) for a period of five years from 2024.

Postgraduate Certificate in Management (Boeing) (N1T914)

1. Location: Durham City and Boeing premises at locations in Europe agreed in advance of each programme start date.
2. Duration: 8 months (part-time).

Admissions

3. Applicants should normally have a minimum of three years' relevant work experience.
4. English language requirements: Candidates whose first language is not English will normally be required to possess recent English Language test scores of 7.0 or above (with no element below 6.0) in IELTS, or an equivalent qualification.

Assessment and award

6. In order to be awarded the Postgraduate Certificate in Management, students must achieve a mark of 50% or above in each module. Students who achieve a mark of less than 50% in any module at the first attempt are allowed one further attempt to pass the module. The total number of modules which a student may resit must total no more than 30 credits. Module retakes shall normally take place within six months of the first attempt.
7. The requirement for the award of the Postgraduate Certificate in Management with Distinction shall be the achievement of an overall average mark of at least 70% across all the modules taken.
8. The requirement for the award of the Postgraduate Certificate in Management with Merit shall be the achievement of an overall average mark of at least 60% across all the modules taken, but where the candidate did not meet the criteria for the award of a Distinction.
