# MSc Arab World Studies (T6K109)

- 1. This programme is available at Durham City in a full-time (24 months) mode of study.

## Assessment, progression and award

8. Modules marked with a ~ must be passed at 50% or above; a mark of 40-49% cannot be compensated.

- 9. Modules marked with a \* are not available during the 2024–25 academic year.
- 10. SGIA 40160 Dissertation must be a Middle East related topic.
- 11. The requirements for the award of MSc Arab World Studies with distinction shall be as follows:
  - a. the achievement of an overall average mark of at least 70% or more across all Level 4 modules taken in years one and two;
  - b. the achievement of a mark of 70% or more in the dissertation and an overall average of 70% or more in the Arabic language modules.
- 12. Candidates for the MSc programme who fail to satisfy the requirements for the award of MSc but who have achieved a minimum of 180 credits at Masters level, including a Masters level pass in the Dissertation, shall be eligible for the degree of Master of Arts in International Affairs (The Arab World) (T6KD07).
- 13. Candidates who have completed Year 2 and have not met the requirements for the award of the MSc Arab World Studies or the award of Master of Arts in International Affairs (The Arab World) shall be eligible for the awards of Postgraduate Diploma or Postgraduate Certificate in Arab World Studies.
- 14. †Candidates with prior knowledge and understanding at the appropriate level may take an alternative 15 credit module from List A instead of EITHER (not both) modules marked†. If students do not take SGIA 49915 Quantitative Methods and Analysis, the alternative 15 credit module MUST be quantitative; if students do not take SOCI 58815 Qualitative Methods and Analysis, the alternative 15 credit module MUST be qualitative.
