Year 3 (Year Abroad)

- 8. Students are required to complete a full academic year studying Chinese at an educational institution in China, and to complete all of the assessments associated with their studies.
- 9. During their time abroad, students will complete a Year Abroad assignment for the language they will study at Level 3. The assignments will be submitted before the start of the Michaelmas Term of the candidate's final year of study. Part-time candidates will be assessed at the start of the year in which the Level 3 compulsory language module is taken. Candidates who pass will proceed to the BA Chinese Studies with Year Abroad (T102). Those who fail will be transferred to the non-year abroad version of the programme, the BA Chinese Studies (T104).

- 16. Modules delivered within and outside the School of Modern Languages and Cultures may have prerequisites. Students should seek advice from the School regarding their module choices from Level 1 onwards.
- 17. Modules marked \$ may not be studied alongside any other CFLS coded modules.
- 18. No student may commence the study of Japanese or Korean in the final year.
