#### Year 3 (Year Abroad)

- 7. Students are required to complete a full academic year studying Japanese at an educational institution in Japan, and to complete all of the assessments associated with their studies.
- 8. During the course of their time abroad, students will complete a summative Year Abroad assignment for the language they wish to study at Level 3. The assignments will be submitted before the start of the Michaelmas Term of the candidate's final year of study. Part-time candidates will be assessed at the start of the year in which the Level 3 compulsory language module is taken. Candidates who pass will proceed to the BA Japanese Studies with Year Abroad (T202). Those who fail will be transferred to the non-year abroad version of the programme, the BA Japanese Studies (T204).

#### Assessment, progression and award

- 12. Modules marked indicate that all students must undertake a 40 credit dissertation at Level 3.
- 13. Modules marked # may only be taken alongside a 20 credit culture module offered by the School of Modern Languages and Cultures in the same language area and at the same level.
- 14. Modules marked ~ are only available by special permission of the programme director.
- 15. Modules delivered within and outside the School of Modern Languages and Cultures may have prerequisites. Students should seek advice from the School regarding their module choices from Level 1 onwards.
- 16. Modules marked \$ may not be studied alongside any other CFLS-coded modules.
- 17. No student may commence the study of Chinese or Korean in the final year.
