Assessment, progression and award

- 5. Modules marked with ~ must be passed at 50% or above; a mark of 40-49% cannot be compensated.
- 6. Total credits may exceed 180 if a 20-credit language module is taken but only with the agreement of the Programme Director, and must not exceed 200 credits. Any language option must be directly related to the study of the region.
