### **Assessment, progression and award**

4. Modules marked with ~ must be passed at 50% or above; a mark of 40-49% cannot be compensated.
5. Total credits may exceed 180 if ARAB 1012 or another language module is taken but may not exceed 200 credits. Credits totalling more than 190 require agreement by the Programme Director. Any language option must be directly related to the study of the region.
6. Optional modules are subject to timetable compatibility. Not all optional modules will run every year.
7. Modules marked with \* are not available during the 2025–26 academic year.
