### **Programme Structure:**

#### **B. Core Modules**

- 5. All candidates for the MA in any of the above programmes shall study and be assessed in **Core Modules** as described below.
- 6. Candidates for the **MA** in **Classics** shall study and be assessed in core modules to the value of 30 or 60 credits from List B1 below. Seminar modules require the ability to read the language independently to such a level as would be expected from a student who has studied the language for at least one year as an undergraduate (or equivalent). Research modules are for those with less than one year of study of the language as an undergraduate (or equivalent).

- 8. Candidates for the **MA** in English Literary Studies shall study and be assessed in the 90 credit ENGL 44790 Integrated Dissertation in English Literary Studies (which includes 30 credits of core teaching): they are not required to take any additional core modules.
- 9. Candidates for the **MA in Environmental Humanities** shall study and be assessed in the 30 credit ARTS 40430 Environmental Humanities: Frameworks and Debates: they are not required to take any additional core modules.
- 10. Candidates for the **MA in History** shall study and be assessed in the 30 credit HIST 45330 Themes, Readings and Sources: they are not required to take any additional core modules.
- 11. Candidates for the MA in Languages, Literatures and Cultures shall study and be assessed in the 30 credit MELA 45930 Critical Theory and Frameworks: they are not required to take any additional core modules.
- 12. Candidates for the **MA in Medical Humanities** shall study and be assessed in the following core modules to the value of 60 credits:

- 13. Candidates for the MA in Medieval and Early Modern Studies shall study and be assessed in the 30 credit ARTS41030 Understanding the Medieval and Early Modern Past: they are not required to take any additional core modules.
- 14. Candidates for the **MA** in **Music** shall study and be assessed in core modules to the value of 30 credits from List B3 (except for students on *Pathway 1*) and 60 credits from List B4 below. Additionally, either 30 credits (for students on *Pathways 2-5*) or 60 credits (for students on *Pathway 1*) must be chosen from List B5 and/or from the lists of elective modules (C1-C16). Students cannot take both MUSI43160 and MUSI 43530 or both MUSI42960 and MUSI43430.

- 15. Candidates for the **MA in Philosophy** shall study and be assessed in the 30 credit PHIL 51030 Philosophical Perspectives: they are not required to take any additional core modules.
- 16. Candidates for the MA in Social and Economic History (Research Methods) shall study and be assessed in core modules to the value of 75 credits from List B6, and to the value of 15 credits from List B7. Candidates who can demonstrate prior knowledge and understanding of quantitative methods and/or qualitative methods may take an additional 15 credits from List B7: however, students cannot replace both SGIA49915 and SOCI58815 with credits from List B7. Students must take the combination of modules, as described above so that the programme will meet the conditions for ESRC accreditation. However, this may mean that certain A&H elective modules will be unavailable to them: in the event of a timetable-clash, the core modules as described here must take precedence.

#### **C. Elective Modules**

- 20. Candidates for the MA in any of the above programmes shall study and be assessed in a number of **Elective Modules**, chosen from Lists C1–C16 in Appendix I (also listed on the 'Faculty of Arts and Humanities PGT Elective Modules' webpage (https://www.durham.ac.uk/departments/academic/arts-humanities/study/postgraduate-taught-elective-modules/), subject to the following conditions:
  - a. No candidate may take more than one module from any single List (C1–C16).
  - b. Candidates should take elective modules to the values stated below (according to their programme), so that the total value of modules taken is exactly 180 credits.
  - c. Candidates who choose to take a CFLS module will take 200 credits in total.
  - d. The stated prerequisites and/or corequisites for each module are met.

- 21. In place of one or more A&H elective modules, students may take open modules to the equivalent value offered by other faculties, subject both to timetabling-compatibility and to the approval of the programme director.
- 22. In addition, candidates for all of the above programmes may (but are not required to) take up to 20 credits offered by the University's Centre for Foreign Language Study (CFLS), noting that any candidate who takes this option will finish with 200 credits overall (i.e. 180 credits plus an additional 20 credits via CFLS).
