- 1. This programme is available at Durham City, in a full-time mode of study.
- 2. The BSc Psychology with Year Abroad (C801) and BSc Psychology with Placement (C806) programmes are only available to students admitted to the BSc Psychology (C800) programme.

Year 3 (Year Abroad)

- 6 Students will undertake an approved placement in an overseas university taking a course of study chosen in consultation with the programme director and the host institution.
- Students whom the Board of Examiners deems to have made satisfactory progress on the year 7. abroad, judged by reference to each student's learning agreement, will continue to Level 3 of the BSc Psychology (with Year Abroad) (C801) programme. Students who have not made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will not be permitted to continue on the BSc Psychology (with Year Abroad) (C801) programme but must instead proceed to the final year of the BSc Psychology (C800) programme.

Year 3 (Placement)

- Students will undertake an approved placement taking a course of study chosen in consultation 8. with the programme director and the host institution.
- 9. Students whom the Board of Examiners deems to have made satisfactory progress on the placement, judged by reference to each student's learning agreement, will continue to Level 3 of the BSc Psychology (with Placement) (C806) programme. Students who have not made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will not be permitted to continue on the BSc Psychology (with Placement) (C806) programme but must instead proceed to the final year of the BSc Psychology (C800) programme.

Assessment, progression and award

- 12. Modules marked with the # symbol must be passed at 40% or above in order to progress to the next level of study.
- 13. Modules marked with the ~ symbol must be passed at 40% or above for the award of an honours degree. A mark of 30-39% cannot be compensated.

Year Abroad

- 14. The BSc Psychology with Year Abroad (C801) programme is only available to students admitted to the BSc Psychology (C800) programme.
- 15. Candidates wishing to transfer to BSc Psychology (with Year Abroad) (C801) must:
 - have successfully completed BSc Psychology (C800) Level 1 and progressed to Level 2 of the programme;
 - b. during the first term of Level 2 study, apply to the Board of Studies in Psychology to be admitted to the BSc Psychology (with Year Abroad) (C801) and have their application approved by the Chair of the Board of Studies in Psychology;
 - c. successfully complete Level 2 of the BSc Psychology (C800) so as to be eligible to progress to Level 3 of the BSc Psychology (C800) programme.

Placement

- 16. The BSc Psychology with Placement (C806) programme is only available to students admitted to the BSc Psychology (C800) programme.
- 17. Candidates wishing to transfer to BSc Psychology (with Placement) (C806) must:

- a. have successfully completed BSc Psychology (C800) Level 1 and progressed to Level 2 of the programme;
- b. during the first term of Level 2 study, apply to the Board of Studies in Psychology to be admitted to the BSc Psychology (with Placement) (C806) and have their application approved by the Chair of the Board of Studies in Psychology;
- c. successfully complete Level 2 of the BSc Psychology (C800) so as to be eligible to progress to Level 3 of the BSc Psychology (C800) programme.

Professional accreditation

- 18. This programme is accredited on an ongoing basis from the 2012-13 intake as conferring eligibility for the Graduate Basis for Chartered Membership of the British Psychological Society. Students entering in and after October 2006 need to achieve a minimum of a second class honours degree to gain eligibility.
- 19. The empirical project (PSYC3102 Psychology Dissertation) must be passed in order to achieve Graduate Basis for Chartered membership.
- 20. A minimum of a second class honours degree is required to gain eligibility for Graduate Basis for Chartered membership.
