Year 3 (Year Abroad)

During the third year of study students must undertake a period of residence in France and must study 40 credits from those modules offered on the 'licence sciences economique' (3rd year modules), those designed for students who specialise in either 'Economie Internationale' or 'Economie et Gestion de l'enterprise' at the University of Aix-Marseilles II. Students should pass a minimum of 40 ECTS credits to successfully complete the year.

- 9. Students registered to L1R1 BA Economics with French have been granted an exemption from the requirement to take at least one other French Studies module at the relevant level alongside FREN 2051 or FREN 3041.
- 10. Note: modules with fewer than 20 students enrolled may not run.
- 11. Modules marked with a # must be at 40% or above in order to progress to the next level of study.
- 12. Modules marked with a \sim must be passed at 40% or above for the award of an honours degree. A mark of 30 39% cannot be compensated.
- 13. Students who the Board of Examiners for the Business School deem to have made satisfactory progress on the Year Abroad will continue to Level 3 of the BA Economics with French (L1R1). Students who have not made satisfactory progress on the year abroad will not be permitted to continue on BA Economics with French (L1R1) but must instead proceed to Level 3 of the BA Economics (L100) programme.
