Assessment, progression and award

- Candidates must progress in at least one language from Beginners' to Intermediate to Advanced or from Intermediate to Advanced to Higher across the three levels of their degree.
- Modules marked # must be passed at 40% or above in order to progress to the next level of study.
- Modules marked ~ must be passed at 40% or above for the award of an honours degree. A mark of 30-39% cannot be compensated.

15. Candidates may choose modules from other Boards of Studies to the maximum value of 40 credits across Levels 2 and 3 together.
16. With reference to the Core Regulations for Undergraduate Programmes pt 13 *"Where undergraduate modules are delivered entirely in a single term, students undertaking such modules should be permitted to take no more than 70 credits in total in a single term."*
17. Exceptionally for academic year 2025/26 only, candidates may, with the written permission of the Director of Undergraduate Studies, take 20 credits of programme-specific Level 1 modules during Level 2 study (subject to timetable compatibility).
18. Exceptionally for academic year 2025/26 only, candidates may, with the written permission of the Director of Undergraduate Studies, take 20 credits of programme-specific Level 2 modules during Level 3 study (subject to timetable compatibility).

Year 3 (Year Abroad)

19. Students admitted to the BA Classics (Q801) are able to apply to transfer to the BA Classics (with Year Abroad) programme (Q806). Students taking the BA Classics (with Year Abroad) (Q806) will undertake an approved study placement in an overseas university following a course of study chosen in consultation with the Department of Classics & Ancient History and with the host institution in which modules relating to Classics and Ancient History comprise a minimum of 50%. During the year abroad students will be assessed at module level by the host University. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of the degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the BA Classics (with Year Abroad) (Q806).
20. Candidates wishing to transfer to the BA Classics (with Year Abroad) (Q806) must:
 - a. have successfully completed Level 1 of the BA Classics (Q801) and progressed to Level 2 of the Honours programme; and
 - b. during their Level 2 study, apply to the Board of Studies in the Department of Classics & Ancient History to be admitted to the BA Classics (with Year Abroad) (Q806) and have their application approved by the Chair of the Board of Studies; and
 - c. secure an international placement abroad/year abroad opportunity, agreed with the Department Exchange Co-ordinator; and
 - d. successfully complete Level 2 of the BA Classics (Q801) so as to be eligible to progress to Level 3 of the BA Classics (Q801).
21. Students whom the Board of Examiners for the Department of Classics & Ancient History deem to have made satisfactory progress on the year abroad, judged by reference to each student's learning agreement, will continue to Level 3 of the BA Classics (with Year Abroad) (Q806). Students who are not deemed to have made satisfactory progress on the year abroad by the Board of Examiners for the Department of Classics & Ancient History will not be permitted to continue on the BA Classics (with Year Abroad) (Q806) programme, but must instead proceed to the final year of the BA Classics programme (Q801).

Year 3 (Placement Year)

22. Students admitted to the BA Classics (Q801) are able to apply to transfer to the BA Classics (with Placement Year) programme (Q808). Students taking the BA Classics (with Placement Year) (Q808) will undertake an approved placement or placements in a UK or overseas organisation consisting of at least 40 weeks of professional-level work experience.

Following the placement year, students will be required to successfully complete a placement assessment as agreed by the Department, to determine whether the programme learning outcomes have been met. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of the degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the BA Classics (with Placement Year) (Q808). If a student fails, they will transfer to the BA Classics (Q801) programme.
23. Candidates wishing to transfer to the BA Classics (with Placement Year) (Q808) must:
 - a. have successfully completed Level 1 of the BA Classics (Q801) and progressed to Level 2 of the Honours programme; and

- b. during their Level 2 study, apply to the Board of Studies in the Department of Classics & Ancient History to be admitted to the BA Classics (with Placement Year) (Q808) and have their application approved by the Chair of the Board of Studies; and
 - c. secure a placement / year abroad opportunity or opportunities comprising at least 40 weeks of professional-level work experience, agreed with the Departmental Placement Year Convenor and Faculty Placement Officer; and
 - d. successfully complete Level 2 of the BA Classics (Q801) so as to be eligible to progress to Level 3 of the BA Classics (Q801).
24. Students whom the Board of Examiners for the Department of Classics & Ancient History deem to have fulfilled the programme learning outcomes and who successfully pass the placement assessment will continue to Level 3 of the BA Classics (with Placement Year) (Q808). Students who fail will not be permitted to continue on the BA Classics (with Placement Year) (Q808) programme, but must instead proceed to the final year of the BA Classics programme (Q801).
