4. Candidates on **Pathway 1** must study and be assessed in modules from **EITHER** List A1 (Latin Language modules) **OR** List A2 (Greek Language Modules) to the value of 40 credits; and two modules to the value of 40 credits from List B and/or List C.
5. Candidates on **Pathway 2** must study and be assessed in modules to the value of 40 credits from List A1 **AND** modules to the value of 40 credits from List A2.
6. Candidates must pass at least one of the modules in List A1 or List A2 below at 40% or above in order to progress to the next level of study.

10. Candidates on **Pathway 1** must study and be assessed in modules from **EITHER** List D1 **OR** List D2 to the value of 40 credits; **one** module from List E to the value of 20 credits; and **two** of the Exploration modules to the value of 40 credits (see paragraph 14 below).
11. Candidates on **Pathway 2** must study and be assessed in modules from List D1 **AND** List D2 to the value of 60 credits; and **two** modules from List E to the value of 40 credits.
12. Candidates on **Pathway 3** must study and be assessed in modules from List D1 to the value of 40 credits **AND** modules from List D2 to the value of 40 credits; and **one** module from List E to the value of 20 credits.
13. Candidates must pass at least one of the modules in List D1 or List D2 below at 40% or above to progress to the next level of study.

15. In place of an Exploration module in either List F (Michaelmas Term) or List G (Epiphany Term), candidates on Pathway 1 may choose to undertake an appropriate language module offered by the

University's Centre for Foreign Language Study, subject to timetabling-compatibility and to approval by the Centre. If candidates choose a CFLS module in this way, then they will take 50cr in one term and 70cr the other. This is because they are replacing a single-term module with one that runs throughout both Michaelmas and Epiphany.

18. Candidates on all pathways must study and be assessed in the appropriate language progression from Level 2.

19. Candidates on **Pathway 1** must study and be assessed in modules from **either** List H1 (Latin Language modules) **or** List H2 (Greek Language modules) to the value of 40 credits, **and two** modules from Lists I, J1, J2, J3 (non-language modules) and K (Centre for Foreign Language Study modules) to the value of 40 credits. Candidates must never select more than **one** module from any of Lists J1, J2, J3 and K.

20. Candidates on **Pathway 2** must study and be assessed in modules from List H1 (Latin Language modules) **and** List H2 (Greek Language modules) to the value of 60 credits; and in **one** module from Lists I, J1, J2, J3 (non-language modules) and K (Centre for Foreign Language Study modules) to the value of 20 credits.

21. Candidates on **Pathway 3** must study and be assessed in modules from List H1 (Latin Language modules) to the value of 40 credits **and** modules from List H2 (Greek Language modules) to the value of 40 credits.

22. Candidates are not permitted to take both CLAS 3431 Higher Greek 1 and CLAS 3231 Higher Latin 1, nor to take both CLAS 3441 Higher Greek 2 and CLAS 3241 Higher Latin 2.

Assessment, progression and award

- Candidates must progress in at least one language from Beginners' to Intermediate to Advanced or from Intermediate to Advanced to Higher across the three levels of their degree.
- Modules marked # must be passed at 40% or above in order to progress to the next level of study.
- Modules marked ~ must be passed at 40% or above for the award of an honours degree. A mark of 30-39% cannot be compensated.
- With reference to the Core Regulations for Undergraduate Programmes pt 13 "Where undergraduate modules are delivered entirely in a single term, students undertaking such modules should be permitted to take no more than 70 credits in total in a single term."

Year 3 (Year Abroad)

27. Students admitted to the BA Classics (Q801) are able to apply to transfer to the BA Classics (with Year Abroad) programme (Q806). Students taking the BA Classics (with Year Abroad) (Q806) will undertake an approved study placement in an overseas university following a course of study chosen in consultation with the the Department of Classics & Ancient History and with the host institution in which modules relating to Classics and Ancient History comprise a minimum of 50%. During the year abroad students will be assessed at module level by the host University. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of the degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the BA Classics (with Year Abroad) (Q806).
28. Candidates wishing to transfer to the BA Classics (with Year Abroad) (Q806) must:
 - a. have successfully completed Level 1 of the BA Classics (Q801) and progressed to Level 2 of the Honours programme; and
 - b. during their Level 2 study, apply to the Board of Studies in the Department of Classics & Ancient History to be admitted to the BA Classics (with Year Abroad) (Q806) and have their application approved by the Chair of the Board of Studies; and
 - c. secure an international placement abroad/year abroad opportunity, agreed with the Department Exchange Co-ordinator; and
 - d. successfully complete Level 2 of the BA Classics (Q801) so as to be eligible to progress to Level 3 of the BA Classics (Q801).
29. Students whom the Board of Examiners for the Department of Classics & Ancient History deem to have made satisfactory progress on the year abroad, judged by reference to each student's learning agreement, will continue to Level 3 of the BA Classics (with Year Abroad) (Q806). Students who are not deemed to have made satisfactory progress on the year abroad by the Board of Examiners for the Department of Classics & Ancient History will not be permitted to continue on the BA Classics (with Year Abroad) (Q806) programme, but must instead proceed to the final year of the BA Classics programme (Q801).

Year 3 (Placement Year)

30. Students admitted to the BA Classics (Q801) are able to apply to transfer to the BA Classics (with Placement Year) programme (Q808). Students taking the BA Classics (with Placement Year) (Q808) will undertake an approved placement or placements in a UK or overseas organisation consisting of at least 40 weeks of professional-level work experience.

Following the placement year, students will be required to successfully complete a placement assessment as agreed by the Department, to determine whether the programme learning outcomes have been met. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of the degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the BA Classics (with Placement Year) (Q808). If a student fails, they will transfer to the BA Classics (Q801) programme.
31. Candidates wishing to transfer to the BA Classics (with Placement Year) (Q808) must:
 - a. have successfully completed Level 1 of the BA Classics (Q801) and progressed to Level 2 of the Honours programme; and
 - b. during their Level 2 study, apply to the Board of Studies in the Department of Classics & Ancient History to be admitted to the BA Classics (with Placement Year) (Q808) and have their application approved by the Chair of the Board of Studies; and
 - c. secure a placement / year abroad opportunity or opportunities comprising at least 40 weeks of professional-level work experience, agreed with the Departmental Placement Year Convenor and Faculty Placement Officer; and
 - d. successfully complete Level 2 of the BA Classics (Q801) so as to be eligible to progress to Level 3 of the BA Classics (Q801).
32. Students whom the Board of Examiners for the Department of Classics & Ancient History deem to have fulfilled the programme learning outcomes and who successfully pass the placement assessment will continue to Level 3 of the BA Classics (with Placement Year) (Q808). Students

who fail will not be permitted to continue on the BA Classics (with Placement Year) (Q808) programme, but must instead proceed to the final year of the BA Classics programme (Q801).
