12. In place of an Exploration module in either List F (Michaelmas Term) or List G (Epiphany Term), candidates may choose to undertake an appropriate language module offered by the University's Centre for Foreign Language Study, subject to timetabling-compatibility and to approval by the Centre. If candidates choose a CFLS module in this way, then they will take 50cr in one term and 70cr the other. This is because they are replacing a single-term module with one that runs throughout both Michaelmas and Epiphany.

15. Candidates on **Pathway 1** must study and be assessed in **four** modules from Lists I, J1, J2, J3 (non-language modules) and K (Centre for Foreign Language Study modules) to the value of 80 credits. Candidates may select up to three modules from List I, but never more than one module from each of Lists J1, J2, J3 and K.

16. Candidates on **Pathway 2** must study and be assessed in **two** modules from **EITHER** List H1 (Latin Language modules) **OR** List H2 (Greek Language modules) to the value of 40 credits; **AND** in **two** modules from Lists I, J1, J2, J3 (non-language modules) and K (Centre for Foreign Language Study modules) to the value of 40 credits, but never more than **two** modules from List I and never more than **one** module from each of Lists J1, J2, J3 and K.

17. Candidates on **Pathway 3** must study and be assessed in **one 20-credit** module from **EITHER** List H1 (Latin Language modules) **OR** List H2 (Greek Language modules), **AND** in **three** modules from Lists I, J1, J2, J3 (non-language modules) and K (Centre for Foreign Language Study modules)) to the value of 60 credits, but never more than **two** modules from List I and never more than **one** module from each of Lists J1, J2, J3 and K.

18. Candidates are not permitted to take both CLAS 3431 Higher Greek 1 and CLAS 3231 Higher Latin 1, nor to take both CLAS 3441 Higher Greek 2 and CLAS 3241 Higher Latin 2.

Assessment, progression and award

19. With reference to the Core Regulations for Undergraduate Programmes pt 13 “*Where undergraduate modules are delivered entirely in a single term, students undertaking such modules should be permitted to take no more than 70 credits in total in a single term.*”
20. Modules marked # must be passed at 40% or above in order to progress to the next level of study.
21. Modules marked ~ must be passed at 40% or above for the award of an honours degree. A mark of 30-39% cannot be compensated.

Year 3 (Year Abroad)

22. Students admitted to the BA Classical Civilisation (Q820) are able to apply to transfer to the BA Classical Civilisation (with Year Abroad) programme (Q821). Students undertaking the BA Classical Civilisation (with Year Abroad) (Q821) will undertake an approved study placement in an overseas university taking a course of study chosen in consultation with the Department of Classics & Ancient History and with the host institution in which modules relating to Classics and Ancient History comprise a minimum of 50%. During the year abroad students will be assessed at module level by the host University. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of the degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the BA Classical Civilisation (with Year Abroad) (Q821).
23. Candidates wishing to transfer to the BA Classical Civilisation (with Year Abroad) (Q821) must:

- a. have successfully completed Level 1 of the BA Classical Civilisation (Q820) and progressed to Level 2 of the Honours programme; and
 - b. during their Level 2 study, apply to the Board of Studies in the Department of Classics & Ancient History to be admitted to the BA Classical Civilisation (with Year Abroad) (Q821) and have their application approved by the Chair of the Board of Studies; and
 - c. secure an international placement abroad/year abroad opportunity, agreed with the Department Exchange Co-ordinator; and
 - d. successfully complete Level 2 of the BA Classical Civilisation (Q820) so as to be eligible to progress to Level 3 of the BA Classical Civilisation (Q820).
24. Students whom the Board of Examiners for the Department of Classics & Ancient History deem to have made satisfactory progress on the year abroad, judged by reference to each student's learning agreement, will continue to Level 3 of the BA Classical Civilisation (with Year Abroad) (Q821). Students who are not deemed to have made satisfactory progress on the year abroad by the Board of Examiners for the Department of Classics & Ancient History will not be permitted to continue on the BA Classical Civilisation (with Year Abroad) (Q821) programme, but must instead proceed to Level 3 of the BA Classical Civilisation (Q820).

Year 3 (Placement Year)

25. Students admitted to the BA Classical Civilisation (Q820) are able to apply to transfer to the BA Classical Civilisation (with Placement Year) programme (Q822). Students taking the BA Classical Civilisation (with Placement Year) (Q822) will undertake an approved placement or placements in a UK or overseas organisation consisting of at least 40 weeks of professional-level work experience.

Following the placement year, students will be required to successfully complete a placement assessment as agreed by the Department, to determine whether the programme learning outcomes have been met. Assessment does not contribute to the marks used to determine the award of the degree but successful completion is required to qualify for the BA Classical Civilisation (with Placement Year) (Q822). If a student fails, they will transfer to the BA Classical Civilisation (Q820) programme.

26. Candidates wishing to transfer to the BA Classical civilisation (with Placement Year) (Q822) must:
- a. have successfully completed Level 1 of the BA Classical Civilisation (Q820) and progressed to Level 2 of the Honours programme; and
 - b. during their Level 2 study, apply to the Board of Studies in the Department of Classics & Ancient History to be admitted to the BA Classical Civilisation (with Placement) (Q822) and have their application approved by the Chair of the Board of Studies; and
 - c. secure a placement / year abroad opportunity or opportunities comprising at least 40 weeks of professional-level work experience, agreed with the Departmental Placement Year Convenor and Faculty Placement Officer; and
 - d. successfully complete Level 2 of the BA Classical Civilisation (Q820) so as to be eligible to progress to Level 3 of the BA Classical Civilisation (Q820).
27. Students whom the Board of Examiners for the Department of Classics & Ancient History deem to have fulfilled the programme learning outcomes and who successfully pass the placement assessment will continue to Level 3 of the BA Classical Civilisation (with Placement Year) (Q822). Students who fail will not be permitted to continue on the BA Classical Civilisation (with Placement Year) (Q822) programme, but must instead proceed to the final year of the BA Classical Civilisation programme (Q820).
