1. This programme is available at Durham City, in a full-time mode of study. The lead department for the management of this programme is the School of Modern Languages and Cultures.

Level 1 (Certificate)

2. At L1, each candidate must follow one of two pathways in the School of Modern Languages and Cultures, as listed below:

Pathway 1	One language at advanced level
Pathway 2	One language at beginners' level.

3. Within each of these pathways, candidates will take modules from Lists A (Advanced Language), B (Beginners' Language), C (Context modules) and/or D (Foundation modules), according to the rules for each pathway as defined in paragraphs 7 and 8 below.

4. Candidates on **Pathway 1** must study and be assessed in **one** module from List A (Advanced Language) to the value of 20 credits; **one** module from List C (Context modules) to the value of 20 credits; and **one** module from List D (Foundation modules) to the value of 20 credits.
5. Candidates on **Pathway 2** must study and be assessed in **one** module from List B (Beginners' Language) to the value of 40 credits; and **one** module from List D (Foundation modules) to the value of 20 credits.
6. Candidates studying for this programme on a part-time basis must take at least one advanced or beginners' language module during their first year of study at each Level.
7. Advanced language modules (List A) are only open to candidates with an A-Level or equivalent qualification in the relevant language at Grade B or above, and to candidates with an equivalent level of language ability. Candidates who do not have these qualifications in a particular language may be required to undergo a diagnostic test.
8. Language modules offered by the School of Modern Languages and Cultures generally have a code that begins with one of the following prefixes:

FREN	French
GERM	German
SPAN	Hispanic Studies
ITAL	Italian
RUSS	Russian

9. At L1, each of the modules on List D (Foundation modules) is available only to students who are taking at least one language module (either from List A or from List B) that has the same prefix as this Foundation module. Each of the modules on List C (Context modules) is available only to students who are taking one Advanced language module (List A) that has the same prefix as this Context module.
10. Candidates should note that Level 2 and Level 3 modules with any of the above prefixes are only available to students who have passed an advanced or beginners' language with the same prefix at the **previous** level.
